**ORDER GRANTING PLAINTIFFS’
MOTION FOR PRELIMINARY
APPROVAL OF CLASS
SETTLEMENT**

WHEREAS, the above-entitled action is pending before this Court (the “Action”);

WHEREAS, Plaintiff Sherry Hunter has moved, pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil
Procedure 23(e), for an order approving the Settlement of this Action in accordance with the
Class Action Settlement Agreement (“Settlement Agreement”) attached as Exhibit 1 to the
Declaration of Jack Fitzgerald in Support of Plaintiffs’ Motion for Preliminary Approval of
Class Settlement (the “Motion”), which Settlement Agreement sets forth the terms and
conditions for a proposed classwide settlement of the Action (ECF No. 111);

WHEREAS Defendants Nature’s Way Products, LLC and Schwabe North America,
Inc. have filed a notice of non-opposition to the Motion (ECF No. 112) and the docket reflects
that no other opposition to the Motion has been filed;

1 WHEREAS, the Court, has read and considered the Settlement Agreement and
2 considered Plaintiffs' Motion and related filings; and

3 WHEREAS, all capitalized terms herein have the same meanings as set forth in the
4 Settlement Agreement.

5 **NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY FOUND AND ORDERED:**

6 1. The Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of the Action and over all
7 Parties to the Action, including all members of the Settlement Class.

8 2. The Court finds on a preliminary basis that the Settlement as set forth in the
9 Settlement Agreement falls within the range of reasonableness. Therefore, the Court
10 preliminarily approves the Settlement Agreement and the Settlement set forth therein, as fair,
11 reasonable, and adequate to the Class.

12 3. The Court conditionally certifies, for settlement purposes only, a Class defined
13 as all persons in the United States who purchased, for personal or household use, Nature's
14 Way Extra semi-solid Extra Virgin Coconut Oil in 16-ounce or 32-ounce jars and/or Nature's
15 Way Liquid Coconut Cooking Oil in 10-ounce or 20-ounce jars.

16 4. The Court finds, for settlement purposes only, that class certification under
17 Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 23(b)(3) is appropriate in the settlement context because (a)
18 the Settlement Class Members are so numerous that joinder of all Settlement Class Members
19 is impracticable; (b) there are questions of law and fact common to the Settlement Class
20 which predominate over any individual questions; (c) the claims of the plaintiffs and proposed
21 Class Representatives are typical of the claims of the Settlement Class; (d) the plaintiffs and
22 proposed Class Representatives and their counsel will fairly and adequately represent and
23 protect the interests of the Settlement Class Members; (e) questions of law or fact common
24 to the Settlement Class Members predominate over any questions affecting only individual
25 the Settlement Class Members; and (f) a class action is superior to other available methods
26 for the fair and efficient adjudication of the controversy.

27 5. The Court appoints Plaintiff Sherry Hunter as Class Representative.

1 6. The Court appoints The Law Office of Paul K. Joseph, PC, and The Law Office
2 of Jack Fitzgerald, PC as Class Counsel.

3 7. The Court finds that, subject to the Final Approval hearing, the proposed
4 Settlement Agreement is fair, reasonable, adequate, and in the best interests of the Settlement
5 Class. The Court further finds that the Settlement Agreement substantially fulfills the
6 purposes and objectives of the class action and provides beneficial relief to the Settlement
7 Class. The Court also finds that the Settlement Agreement: (a) is the result of serious,
8 informed, non-collusive arms'-length negotiations, involving experienced counsel familiar
9 with the legal and factual issues of this case and made with the assistance and supervision of
10 the Hon. Andrew G. Schopler (b) meets all applicable requirements of law, including Federal
11 Rule of Civil Procedure 23, and the Class Action Fairness Act ("CAFA"), 28 U.S.C. § 1715.

12 8. The Court hereby approves RG2 to act as Claims Administrator, and approves
13 the form and content of the Class Notice in the form attached to the Settlement Agreement as
14 Exhibit A (Long Form Notice). The Court finds that dissemination of the Class Notice as
15 proposed in the Settlement Agreement meets the requirements of Federal Rule of Civil
16 Procedure 23(c)(2), and due process, and further constitutes the best notice practicable under
17 the circumstances. Accordingly, the Court hereby approves the Notice Plan as set forth in
18 paragraph 3.2 of the Settlement Agreement and in the Declaration of William W.
19 Wickersham, attached to the Settlement Agreement as Exhibit B.

20 9. The Court adopts the schedule proposed by Plaintiff, as follows:

4 10. A hearing (the “Final Approval Hearing”) has been reserved at 1:30 P.M. on
5 December 13, 2019, to be held before this Court to determine whether the proposed settlement
6 of the Action on the terms and conditions provided for in the Settlement Agreement is fair,
7 reasonable, and adequate to the Settlement Class and should be finally approved by the Court;
8 whether a Judgment as provided in the Settlement Agreement should be entered; and to
9 determine any amount of fees, costs, and expenses that should be awarded to Class Counsel
10 and any award to the Plaintiffs for their representation of, or service on behalf of, the
11 Settlement Class.


12 11. The Court reserves the right to adjourn the date of the Final Approval Hearing
13 without further notice to the members of the Settlement Class, and retains jurisdiction to
14 consider all further applications arising out of or connected with the proposed settlement. The
15 Court may approve the settlement, with such modifications as may be agreed to by the settling
16 Parties, if appropriate, without further notice to the Settlement Class.

17 12. All discovery and proceedings in this Action are stayed until further order of this
18 Court, except as may be necessary to implement the settlement or comply with the terms of
19 the Settlement Agreement.

20 ^{13.} By entering this order, the Court does not make any determination as to the merits of
21 this case. Preliminary approval of the Settlement Agreement is not a finding or admission of
22 liability by Defendants.
